As well as a signed recommendation letter from the halfway house with their contact information. Please note that the YMCA scans all who enter through the Sex Offender Registry.

ANY TEENS WHO WISH TO APPLY: (We will not require you to provide income information from your parents)

Report Cards- Teen memberships will be renewed on a quarterly basis we will require the most up-to-date school report card.

Teens must provide a recommendation letter from teacher or coach to why the YMCA will help the teen.
